



# Academic Profile 2019-2022

Westchester Hebrew High School (WHHS), founded in 1971, is a modern Orthodox High School located on 27 acres in Mamaroneck, NY. Our students come from Westchester, Connecticut, Queens, Riverdale, Rockland, New Jersey and New York City.

<b>ACCREDITATION</b>	WHHS is registered by the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York - Department of Education.																				
<b>SCHOOL</b>	We are a private school, with a population of 114 students in grades 9 through 12. Our religious and secular faculty members consist of 25 men and women, 90% of whom have earned advanced degrees.																				
<b>PROGRAM</b>	The school year is divided into four quarters of approximately 10 weeks each. Mid-term exams are given at the end of January. Advanced Placement exams are given in May and Finals and Regents are given in June.																				
<b>CURRICULUM</b>	Our college preparatory program consists of a dual curriculum (Secular Studies and Judaic Studies) which is required for all students.

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## GRADING POLICY

WHHS does not rank students. Grade averages are calculated after each semester using actual numeric grades. Course grades are not weighted. Students are grouped according to their ability.
